

Dill: Bouquet

Anethum graveolens

Quick Facts

- Annual herb.
- Very aromatic .
- Deer resistant.
- Attracts pollinators.
- Host for swallowtail butterfly caterpillars.

Tips

Dill is believed to have originated in the Mediterranean and was used to aid digestion. This variety produces early, large seed heads, particularly good for pickling with abundant, early seeds. Foliage is delicious on potatoes, tomatoes salmon, spinach, cucumbers, and lamb chops. Plant extra for the swallowtail butterflies!

Instructions

Sow outside 1-2 weeks before last frost. Sow successively every 2-3 weeks. Sow indoors 8- 10 weeks before last frost. Harvest anytime until plant flowers.

- Full sun (6+ hrs)
- Seed depth: press into surface
- Row spacing: 12 inches
- Seed spacing: 3 seeds every 4"
- Plant height: 30-36"
- Germination: 20-25 days
