

Peas (snow): Avalanche

Pisum sativum

Quick Facts

- Matures 62 days from planting.
- Produces a dark green snow pea.
- Grows as a 36" tall vine with 1 to 2 pods per node.
- A cool-weather crop that is planted in early spring.
- Grows best in well-drained soil.
- Can be planted in late summer for a fall crop.

Tips

Plant in early spring as soon as the soil can be worked. Support with a trellis net or chicken wire to keep vines upright. This is best installed at planting time. Harvest when peas visibly enlarge in their pods, from $2\frac{1}{2}$ " to $3\frac{3}{4}$ ". For fall harvest, plant 2 months before frost.

Instructions

Plant as soon as soil can be worked in early spring. Do not thin after sprouting.

- Full sun
- Seed planting depth: $\frac{1}{2}$ - 1"
- Seed spacing: $1\frac{1}{2}$ - 2"
- Row spacing: 18 - 36"
- Plant height: 3 feet
- Germination: 7 - 10 days
