

# Peas (snap/bush): Sugar Ann

*Pisum Sativum*

## Quick Facts

- Peas prefer cool weather; these grow well in both spring and fall gardens.
- Ready to harvest 56 days after planting.
- Sugar Ann variety grows 10-15 inches and rarely requires staking.
- This variety does well in small spaces; you can plant peas directly in a prepared garden bed or in containers.

## Tips

Till soil in early spring as soon as soil can be worked or in early fall two months before first frost. Work compost into soil to enhance nutrient content. Water well after planting and ensure soil is lightly moist, not soggy. Sugar Ann Snap peas are versatile since you eat both pods and peas. Delicious both raw and cooked.

## Instructions

Sow directly into a bed or container as soon as soil can be worked. Amend soil with compost for best results. Place empty toilet paper tube around seedlings to protect them from cutworms, snails, and slugs.

- Full sun with well-drained soil
- Seed planting depth: 1/2 - 1"
- Seed spacing: 1½ - 2 inches
- Row spacing: 18 - 24"
- Plant height: 10 - 15 inches
- Germination: 7 - 14 days
